CCD NEWS

Larry Leyba and I began teaching the first-year confirmation class in September. In March we asked the young people a question; “What has changed you, or what have you learned in the last six months? The following are some of their responds:

“I learned how to pray better, and I learned how to get into the habit of going to Mass.”

“One thing I learned was that I improved my faith. I learned that it doesn’t matter if you are beautiful or ugly, wealthy or poor, God and Jesus will love you always and be there for you.”

“I learned about Lent. It’s a cool time of the year I didn’t know about.”

“I feel closer to God.”

“I learned how God sacrificed himself for our sins and how being confirmed can offer new opportunity for faith.”

“I learned how to talk to people I’ve never talked to.”

“I learned how to pray on my own.”

“Something we learned in the last six months is that God will reveal the true meaning of others to me. God will guide me through these people and help me choose the right path/people.”

“. . . I feel more at peace knowing that I’m slowly closer to God.”

“I get closer to Church and God.”

“I learned more about our Catholic faith and the stories about Jesus.”

As a Church and a community, we need to continue to encourage these young people in the journey of faith in which we are all working toward.
