SACRAMENTS

To receive Sacraments at San Miguel Church, you must be registered and active at the Parish. If you are unsure if you are registered, please contact the Parish Office to verify.

Baptism: Pre-baptism instruction is required for parents and god-parents. Sponsors/godparents must be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation and if married, must be married in the Catholic Church. If the godparent is single, they must not be co-habiting. Parents and godparents must attend baptismal classes before the baptism of the child. Parents must register their child at least two weeks before attending class. Contact the office for additional information.

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion: This is a two-year program that begins in the 2nd grade. Contact the Religious Education director for additional information.

Confirmation: This is a two-year program that begins in the 8th grade. Those teens who are registering for Confirmation classes must be Baptized and have received their 1st Holy Communion. Contact the Religious Education director at the Parish Office for additional information.

Marriage: Couples who plan to marry at San Miguel Church must contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. A mandatory pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office.

Funeral Mass: The cost for funeral services is \$150. Please contact the office for additional information and to coordinate services as soon as possible.

When Jesus says he has come not to abolish the law but to fulfill it, what does he mean?

While exposing the Law of the Gospel in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus makes it clear that he hasn't come to abolish the ten commandments or the other six hundred commandments and ordinances that are the Law of Moses. He says he has come instead to fulfill them (Matthew 5:17-18). In today's Gospel he provides an example of what fulfillment is. In testing Jesus, the scholar of the Mosaic Law asks what he must do to inherit eternal life. As usual, Jesus throws back a question instead, because the answer shouldn't be that hard for someone who understands the Mosaic Law. The scholar doesn't disappoint. He quotes from the Law of Moses the greatest prayer of the Jews, the Sh'ma (pronounced Sha-ma). It was prayed multiple times a day by Jews then as now, "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength." (Deuteronomy 6:4-5) The scholar includes another passage that also originates from the Law of Moses "[love] your neighbor as yourself".

Jesus agrees with the scholar. But the scholar, possibly wishing to demonstrate his great knowledge takes it further, asking Jesus "And who is my neighbor?" Why would he ask this? It is because the scholar is quoting from one of the Laws of Moses, "Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against your own people. **You shall love your neighbor as yourself**. I am the LORD." (Leviticus 19:18) This passage indicates that your neighbor is someone from your own people. Jesus' reply to the

scholar's question is the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:29-37) where it's the contemptible Samaritan who treated the Jew mercifully, unlike the priestly Jews who did not. Here, Jesus brings the Mosaic Law to fulfillment by expanding the scope of what neighbor means. In the Mosaic Law, a neighbor is someone from **"your own people"**. In Jesus' fulfillment, your neighbor is **everyone**.

Elsewhere, Jesus is more explicit. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus fulfills the fifth commandment when he says, "You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment.' But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." (Matthew 5:21-22) Note the change. Throughout the Gospels Jesus' announcement of the New Covenant doesn't nullify the Old Covenant, it transforms and completes it; sometimes explicitly and sometimes in a more understated way, like in today's Gospel reading, but always seeking an interior transformation.
