#### **SACRAMENTS**

To receive Sacraments at San Miguel Church, you must be registered and active at the Parish. If you are unsure if you are registered, please contact the Parish Office to verify.

Baptism: Pre-baptism instruction is required for parents and godparents. Sponsors/godparents must be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation and if married, must be married in the Catholic Church. If the godparent is single, they must not be cohabiting. Parents and godparents must attend baptismal classes before the baptism of the child. The next class is November 6, 2025 at 6:30PM. Parents must register their child at least two weeks before attending class. Contact the office for additional information.

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion: This is a two-year program that begins in the 2nd grade. Contact the Religious Education director for additional information.

**Confirmation:** This is a two-year program that begins in the 8th grade. Those teens who are registering for Confirmation classes must be Baptized and have received their 1st Holy Communion. Contact the Religious Education director at the Parish Office for additional information.

Marriage: Couples who plan to marry at San Miguel Church must contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. A mandatory pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office.

Funeral Mass: The cost for funeral services is \$150. Please contact the office for additional information and to coordinate services as soon as possible.

#### Faith

Placed before us today are two readings that concern themselves with faith. In the first is Jesus' teaching that faith as small as a mustard seed can command a tree to be uprooted (Luke 17:5–6), and the second concerns God's answer to Habakkuk's cry of lament, "How long, O LORD?" (Hab 1:2). At first glance their connection seems elusive. Upon closer inspection however, the connection is that both emphasize that true discipleship requires living faith, faith that trusts God, waits upon Him, and allows His power to be unleashed in our lives.

The theologian Brant Pitre describes faith in terms of three attributes: intellectual assent, trust, and fidelity. These attributes are not the same as the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity, but they resonate with them and show how the virtues are lived out in practice.

**Intellectual assent** reflects the act of the virtue of faith itself; believing what God has revealed because He is trustworthy. Augustine put it simply: "Faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of this faith is to see what you believe."

**Trust** highlights the forward-looking character of faith and corresponds closely with hope: it is the reliance on God's promises, even when their fulfillment seems delayed. So, if faith makes the future present in seed form, then the believer must trust that what God has promised, though not yet fully seen, will truly come to pass. Summarily expressed: Faith says: God has revealed this; it is true.

Hope says: Because it is true, I can rely on God to bring it about in the future.

Trust is the interior act that lets us lean on that future reality in the present, even when circumstances seem to contradict it. Trust is what makes faith lived and operative here and now.

**Fidelity** is faith embodied in concrete actions of love (agape), and for that reason it is inseparable from charity. It is the steadfast love of God and neighbor that proves faith alive and authentic. As Paul teaches, what ultimately counts in Christ Jesus is 'faith working through love' (Galatians 5:6).

When the apostles cry out, "Increase our faith!" (Luke 17:5), Jesus' reply shows that they already possess all the faith they need. What they lack is not intellectual assent; they believe in Him. Nor do they lack fidelity in the sense of following Him. What is missing is trust, the confidence that even the little faith they have is enough, because its power rests not in them but in God. Jesus points them back to the attribute of trust, showing that faith only becomes effective when it relies wholly on the Lord's strength. It is as if Jesus said, "You don't need more faith. Even the smallest faith is enough if you truly trust in it, because God's power works through it. What matters is not the quantity of your faith but your confidence that God will act through it."

Habakkuk prophesied during a time of injustice and turmoil. His anguished cry, "How long, O Lord?" is met with God's assurance: the vision will be fulfilled, though it may seem delayed, and "the righteous shall live by faith."

Placed beside Luke's Gospel, Habakkuk's message underlines the same truth: faith is not the ability to see everything at once but the willingness to wait and trust in God's promise. His message is that the faithful do not control the timing of God's plan but endure with trust, confident that God's justice will prevail.

Together, the readings from Habakkuk and Luke reveal two sides of the same coin. Habakkuk teaches us that faith means waiting upon God with steadfast trust, even when His justice seems delayed. Luke's Gospel shows that this very same faith, though it may appear small, is already powerful enough to accomplish what seems impossible, if only we rely on God's strength. One teaches patience, the other confidence; one steadies us in endurance, the other emboldens us in action. United, they remind us that true discipleship is not about acquiring "more" faith, but about living with trust in the faith already given, that is faith that waits, faith that acts, faith that grows into hope and matures into love.


