SACRAMENTS

To receive Sacraments at San Miguel Church, you must be registered and active at the Parish. If you are unsure if you are registered, please contact the Parish Office to verify.

Baptism: Pre-baptism instruction is required for parents and god-parents. Sponsors/godparents must be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, have received all their Sacraments of Initiation and if married, must be married in the Catholic Church. If the godparent is single, they must not be co-habiting. Parents and godparents must attend baptismal classes before the baptism of the child. **The next class is December 4, 2025 at 6:30PM.** Parents must register their child at least two weeks before attending class. Contact the office for additional information.

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion: This is a program that usually begins in the 2nd grade and lasts a minimum of two years. Contact the Religious Education director for additional information.

Confirmation: This is a program that usually begins in the 8th grade and lasts a minimum of two years. Those teens who are registering for Confirmation classes must be Baptized and have received their 1st Holy Communion. Contact the Religious Education director at the Parish Office for additional information.

Marriage: Couples who plan to marry at San Miguel Church must contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. A mandatory pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office.

Funeral Mass: The cost for funeral services is \$150. Please contact the office for additional information and to coordinate services as soon as possible.

The Sunday Essay for the
Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time
November 16, 2025

After leaving the Temple for the last time, Jesus and his disciples entered the Temple and sat on the Mount of Olives. From that vantage point, the Temple dominated the skyline. Its white stones and golden figures gleaming in the sun. When the disciples pointed out to Jesus, Jesus made a prophetic statement. Today's Gospel is Luke's rendition of that prophetic vision, known as the Olivet Discourse, named for the place where it was delivered, the Mount of Olives.

All three Synoptic Gospels place the Olivet Discourse after Jesus' prophetic actions in the Temple and before his arrest, and each preserves its substance while emphasizing different aspects (Matthew 24:1-51, Mark 13, and Luke 21:5-36). In the current liturgical year, the Church prescribes Luke's account (Luke 21:5-36), yet to grasp the full scope of Jesus' teaching, one should read all three accounts, especially Matthew's.

At the heart of the discourse, a prophesy of the end of time is interwoven with a startling near-term prediction: the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple within a generation. Jesus' warning is explicit: "Amen, I say to you, [21:33]
